tion that comes from knowing that this award will continue on, in the name of our class, forever.



Thornapple Area Enrichment Foundation's Grantand Mini-Grant Awards

Two TK Odyssey of the Mind Teams received a \$500 TAEF grant to participate in World Finals

Odyssey of the Mind (OM) is an international educational program that challenges students to use creative problem solving and team work to solve complex problems. This year two elementary teams from Thornapple Kellogg qualified for the OM World Finals. At the OM World Finals teams compete along side thousands of teams throughout the U.S. and the world. The teams used the funds awarded to them from the TAEF to help cover registration and dormitory fees during the four day competition at Iowa State University.



Kiley Hilton received a \$450 TAEF grant to attend two Grand Rapids Civic Theater Courses

Kiley Hilton, a Thornapple Kellogg 8th grade student, was awarded a \$450 grant to attend Theater Wheel and Broadway Bound at the Grand Rapids Civic Theater in the fall of 2012. The Thornapple Area Enrichment Foundation grant was provided by the Donald and Catherine Williamson Visual and Performing Arts Fund, which was developed to provide Visual and Performing Arts opportunities to students in Thornapple Kellogg Schools.

A \$1,000 TAEF grant was awarded to the TK High School Robotics Team to attend World Competition

Thornapple Kellogg High School Robotics Team received the "Design Award" at the VEX Robotics Gateway Competition held at MSU and advanced to the World Championship Competition in Anaheim, California. The team was selected because it demonstrated an organized and professional approach to the design process, project management, time management and team organization. The \$1,000 TAEF grant helped to cover travel and registration expenses for the team.

Page Elementary received a \$500 grant to purchase books for 1st Annual Battle of the Books

Battle of the Books, a nationally recognized program, encourages students to read books through friendly competition. Page Elementary started the program to help increase student reading comprehension. The \$500 TAEF Grant was used to purchase "battle books" for students. In total the students at Page Elementary read 840 books in preparation for the competition.

TAEF helps to bring diversity to Lee Elementary by awarding a \$500 grant for diverse reading material

Lee Elementary began a Diversity Through Literature Program this year, which will expose students to differences in our community. The program will focus on a wide range of differences including racial, cultural, economic, physical and mental health. The \$500 grant provided by TAEF helped Lee Elementary purchase age appropriate books which will introduce these differences to students to instill understanding and tolerance of others.

Thornapple Area Enrichment Foundation contributes \$2,500 to Lee Elementary for a walking path

Lee Elementary received a TAEF Grant for \$2,500 for the construction of a walking path that will be located on the playground. The walking path is being developed to encourage an understanding of lifelong fitness and health.

It will be used by Lee Elementary students at recess and PE class as well as the members of the Fit Girls program which practices at Lee Elementary. The community will also be welcome to use the path during "off school" times. The walking path is scheduled to be completed during the 2012 - 2013 school year.

Thornapple Kellogg Cognitively Impaired Classrooms received a \$2,880 TAEF grant to provide therapeutic horseback riding lessons

Thanks in part to a Thornapple Area Enrichment Foundation grant, thirty-one Thornapple Kellogg students from kindergarten to 12th grade with cognitive impairments, Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Down Syndrome and other health impairments can participate in therapeutic horseback riding at Camp Manitou-Lin. Thornapple Kellogg Cognitive Impaired classrooms received \$2,880 to assist with the cost of the program. Through these riding lessons students gain self esteem, emotional worth, core strength and verbal skills as they work toward learning how to direct and care for a horse. TAEF awarded a total of \$2,000 with the additional \$880 granted through the Calvin C. Plummer Special Needs Fund. The Calvin C. Plummer Special Needs Fund is a TAEF fund developed for the purpose of providing grants to enhance the lives of mentally and/or physically challenged individuals.
