Jim and Diane were married in 1970 and after Jim's graduation in 1972, they moved to Hastings. They chose Hastings to fulfill a medical need at Pennock Hospital. The couple moved to Middleville and raised their family on Gun Lake. Between 1974 and 1981 Jim and Diane had four children: Jessica, Kendra, Lucas and Garrett. All four children graduated from Thornapple Kellogg High School. It was in the midst of raising the four children Diane decided to pursue her career in dental hygiene. Diane graduated from KCC and worked for Dr. Bruce Sexton in Wayland for 26 years until her recent retirement in 2015.

In 1992 Diane was asked to be one of the founding members of the Thornapple Area Enrichment Foundation (TAEF). As a past president, Diane served 23 years as a volunteer board member. TAEF was created as a vehicle for community members to make financial contributions to create scholarships and grants to benefit the Thornapple Kellogg School and community. Diane's goal was to start a tradition of giving in the Thornapple Community. In 2015 Diane retired from the TAEF Board, but remains as a volunteer for the Foundation working to increase classroom and field trip grants to enhance educational opportunities for TK students.

Jim also donated his time for 20 years performing TK's annual athletic physicals. In 1986, Jim

was asked to be the physician consultant for the Thornapple Kellogg Athletics. He valued this position and took it as seriously as his private practice. He continued consulting even after his own children graduated. Many generations can recall "Docs" faithful field attire of no socks, athletic shorts and sports jacket, regardless of the weather. Dr. Weatherhead has received numerous awards and distinctions though out his career including his nomination for "The Compassion in Medicine" Award. In Jim's own words "Just look into your patient's eyes and really listen, you will be able to diagnose the problem".

## GRANTING

TAEF continues to broaden its focus to include community granting that supports community based initiatives in Middleville. Although TAEF began with the focus of education, we understand that we need to support the entire community to ensure a healthy school district. Our TK community continues to grow and so does its needs.

We gave our first community grant this year to the Veteran's Memorial Fund of Middleville to help build a memorial for those who have served.

Community grants will allow us to support many types of projects over the next few years. We are excited to be embarking on this new area of giving, and we hope you will join us in this important work.

#### 2015-2016 **GRANTS**

**\$763** granted from the TAEF - Charles & Margery Williams Youth Activity Fund to purchase a new trailer for the Middleville Boys Scout Troop #105. The trailer will be used to store and haul equipment used for camping, hiking and other outdoor activities.

\$135 granted to purchase a Speech and Language Test to assist TK speech pathologist in diagnosing communication disorders and provide targeted therapy to students.

**\$365** granted to help transport Thornapple Kellogg High School Juniors to college campus visits to Ferris State University and Western Michigan University. The trip exposes students to the college experience and increases interest in attending a college after graduation.

\$500 granted to Lee Elementary for the purchase of child-sized, developmentally appropriate seating to help active students focus by allowing them to rock, twist and turn.

\$1,500 granted to Lee Elementary to purchase Benchmark Writers Workshop resource to assist educators in teaching writing to students.

\$300 granted to TK Middle School to purchase new books for the Power Book Chart.

\$450 granted to TK preschool to cover the cost of two field trips for low income students. The field trips were to Boulder Ridge Animal Park and Cotant's Farm.



\$600 granted to Lee Elementary to purchase Magna-Tiles which provides students with an outlet for creative play that fosters spatial reasoning and math awareness in a fun cooperative way.

\$500 granted to support the construction of the new Veterans Memorial at the pavilion in downtown Middleville.

**\$300** granted to Thornapple Kellogg High school to purchase incentives for Multi-Tiered System of Support, a behavior support program, which encourages positive behavior.

\$2,000 granted to Thornapple Kellogg High school to provide an assembly featuring Kinetic-Effect, a slam poetry group, who designed their presentation around TK's Service Day of Caring.


\$300 granted to the Freeport District Library to support its summer reading program for students.

\$1,000 granted to the moderate cognitive impairment class to attend weekly therapeutic horseback riding lessons at YMCA Camp Manitou-Lin.




